² For example, in 1825 the *New Monthly Magazine* describes a 'new sex', neither male or female: 'man, men; woman, women; noman, nimmen'.* However, they used the concept to mock people who did not conform to the expectations of their biological sex; the 'pretended female' who is loud, confident, and 'known to leap a five-bar gate', and 'pretended males' who are gossips or milksops. The article suggests that these people should be forced to wear half-female and half-male clothes, so that they could 'no longer be mistaken' for a man or woman.
