

**A Writ to the Sherife 1657
(CR173/7)**

Oliv[er] [Cromw]ell Protect[or] of the Comonwealth of Engl[an]d, Scotl[an]d Irel[an]d
and the dom[a]ins thereto belonging to the Sherife of Warwick greeting we comand
you that you take Robert Baylies late of Birmingham in the county butcher

and John Caplewood late of Birmingham in the County tanner -----

If they shall be found in your bayliwick and them safely keep so that you have their
bodies be fore the Justice of the comon bench at Westm[inster] in eight dayes of St
Martin* -----

To answer Thomas Willoughby Esquire of a plea wherefore with force and arms
they brokeyd those of the s[ai]d Thomas [Willoughby] att Warwick and did him other
wrongs

to the greate damage of the s[ai]d Thomas [Willoughby] and ag[ains]t the publique
peace and have you there this writt witnes of St John of Westm[inster] the xxix day of
May ---- ----- in the yeare of o[u]r lord 1657. Edkins Esquire.
