

Letter to Rev. S.H. Beresford, Vicar of Brailes, about the behaviour of the children in church, 25 February 1838, DR308/23

Brailes 25th Feb. 1838

Sir. In corres[pondenc]e to your note, respecting the behaviour of my Children. I beg to observe, that Mrs Long have been to Winderton, to Examine Mr. John Spencer, on the subject. he confidently affirms, that he never saw, or heard any thing improper, by any of them during the Morning you complain of, or at any other time¹, but on the other hand, he have always remarked how very quiet they behaved in Church², and he will tell you at any time, there is not Four better behaved Children In the Parish. As regards my own absence. I refer you to Mr. Lawley Surgeon of this place³ who have attended me almost daily for some time past. I have to regret exceedinly that your severe conduct towards me⁴, will compel my family
